a. Mayor – Right of Way Ordinance

Legal counsel explained that the city could approve an ordinance that required companies to apply for a permit when doing work in the city's Right of Way, however there could not be any fee. No action on item, information was just provided to council of what could be coming to them on future agenda for possible approval. The environmental stage of the TXDOT Project on FM 1093 and FM 1489 has started. Mayor spoke about the TXDOT project that was going to include the bridge on Fort Bend Drive, they stated it could no longer be part of the project, but they may replace the culverts and the gates. The environmental stage of the GLO project is complete and is moving into the next stage. Mayor stated that the adopted budget has now been posted. The City Administrator position has been posted and we have received some applications.

b. City Council

Andrew Perry stated that he would like to say thank you for getting the tree trimming done, and that he had done some research into the private sector for costs of getting the road work done, and it was way out of our price range. Angela King stated that the fire department collected toys and completed their event. They have leftover items, so if anyone knows of families that need assistance please contact the City Secretary and she will relay the information to the appropriate person. Eric Duhon spoke about the technology breakdown and that he believes it will cost \$2700 to get the technology infrastructure to the level we need to stream in the chambers and spoke about a T-Mobile wireless router that provides better service for the purposes of streaming. Kelli Carlson stated that the Christmas Light Judging contest will be held on Monday the 22nd, ballots will be handed out at the park in Valley Lodge and ballots will be accepted from 5:30pm-7:30pm Winner will be announced on the 23rd. She stated that there will be an interactive map for the event.

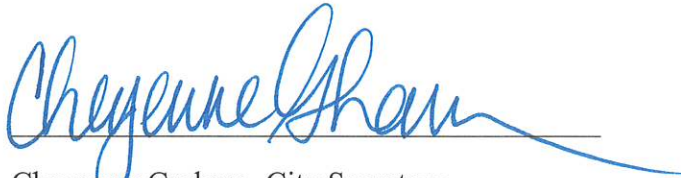
b. Roadway Update
